

is Odawa/Ojibway from the Wikwemikong Unceded First Nation Territory, Manitoulin Island, Ontario. She is a Residential school survivor. She is a retired Registered Nurse, with a B.Sc. N. from the University of Ottawa1977. Her honours include an honorary Doctor in Sacred Letters Honoris Causa from Regis College, University of Toronto, November 1996; The Cross of Honour Medal, conferred by the Pope to the laity for distinguished service to the Church, October 2015.

Rosella volunteers not only in her community but also nationally. She is chair of her Parish Council and serves on the board of the Waaseandimikaaning Board of Trustees. She is a member of the Our Lady of Guadalupe Circle, has worked with the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops and is involved with the Liturgical Working Group and the Papal Visit Toolkit Working Group. She has recently been named Chair of the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund.
