Dear Friends,

I am writing you to provide important information regarding The Southdown Institute and our response during these unprecedented times. As you may be aware, after temporarily suspending all in-person, face-to-face delivery of clinical services in mid-March, we immediately transitioned to providing our outpatient services through on-line video and telephone means with our clinical staff working efficiently and effectively from remote locations.

Today, I am pleased to announce the opening of our Virtual Walk-In Clinic for Clergy, Vowed Religious, and Lay Ecclesial Ministers as an expansion of our tele-psychological services. We understand that the reality of this pandemic may cause a lot of stress, anxiety and depression, trigger difficulty with impulse control, and impact faith and spirituality. The intent of this solution-focused service is to ensure timely access to the high quality mental health and spiritual care provided by Southdown, especially during this challenging time of social distancing due to COVID-19. All of our therapists, spiritual directors and non-clinical service providers are available for this online service. The initial intake with an individual will be by telephone and we will use a secure and PIPEDA compliant Zoom platform for all subsequent confidential sessions.

The Southdown Virtual Walk-In service is available between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time (EDT), Monday to Friday, and can be accessed by calling 289-763-1478 to book an appointment. The intake and two sessions will be provided at no cost and any additional appointments will be provided as needed through our out-patient service on a fee for service basis.
